The undersigned, voters and residents of the village of Hayward, Freeborn County Minnesota, do hereby petition your Honorable Board to call an election in the village of Hayward, Hayward Township, Freeborn County, Minnesota, to determine whether or not to incorporate as a village, the following lands lying in the township of Hayward, Freeborn County, Minnesota, which lands embrace the village of Hayward as it is platted and recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds in and for Freeborn County, Minnesota, to-wit:

Beginning at the southwest corner of section nine (9) Township one-hundred-two (102) north, range twenty(20), west, thence west 80 rods to the southwest corner of the southeast quarter (SE^{$\frac{1}{4}$}) of the Southeast quarter (SE^{$\frac{1}{4}$}) of section eight (8), thence due north 240 rods to the northwest corner of the southeast quarter (SE^{$\frac{1}{4}$}) of the Northeast quarter (NE^{$\frac{1}{4}$}) of said section eight (8), thence due east 240 rods to the northeast corner of the Southeast quarter (SE^{$\frac{1}{4}$}) of the Northwest quarter (NW^{$\frac{1}{4}$}) of section nine (9), thence south 240 rods to the southeast corner of the Southeast quarter (SE^{$\frac{1}{4}$}) of the Southwest quarter (SW^{$\frac{1}{4}$}) of section nine (9), thence west 160 rods to the place of beginning at the southwest corner of said section nine (9), and being contained within said boundary, exactly nine forties, or 360 acres of land.
