

Proclamation

WHEREAS: Huntington's Disease is an inherited deterioration of the central nervous system, wherein each child of an affected person has a 50/50 chance of developing the disease; and

WHEREAS: there has been no development of either a predictive test to relieve the uncertainty for those risking inheritance of Huntington's Disease or a specific drug to abate the distressing symptoms of the disease; and

WHEREAS: families involved with Huntington's Disease suffer extreme and prolonged physical, emotional, financial and social anguish; and

WHEREAS: education and understanding about Huntington's Disease is of the utmost urgency for these patients and their families, their friends, neighbors and the entire professional and public communities; and

WHEREAS: research into all aspects of Huntington's Disease must be encouraged and expanded;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of June, 1978 to be


HUNTINGTON'S DISEASE MONTH
