WHEREAS: the Red School House is an alternative non-profit private school founded in 1972 by

concerned Native American parents; and

WHEREAS: the Red School House, located at 643 Virginia Street, St. Paul, represents a viable and contributing presence in the St. Paul community through its school programs for

Native Americans of all ages who desire a culturally-based educational opportunity;

and

WHEREAS: the Red School House has emphasized its goals through theater and television, and two

years ago, put together a multi-media show, funded by the Minnesota Bicentennial Com-

mission, which emphasized the Native American viewpoint; and

WHEREAS: in its graphic arts program, the school has published a series of books on the Ojibway

story of man, the first Ojibway stories ever to be written; and

WHEREAS: the U.S. Office of Education has named the Red School House as a model school for

Indian education; and

WHEREAS: once again, the Red School House must seek additional funding and community support

in order to maintain its academic curriculum and cultural programs;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, May 20, 1978 to be

NATIVE AMERICAN WALK TOGETHER

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens to support this worthy effort.
