

Proclamation

WHEREAS: the vandalism of highway signs and markers is a serious and costly crime that has contributed to injury and death on our state highways; and

WHEREAS: a bill passed by the 1978 Legislature makes wrongful possession of a highway sign on marker a petty misdemeanor with a fine up to \$100; and

WHEREAS: persons possessing highway signs or markers may avoid prosecution by voluntarily notifying a law enforcement officer of their presence or by delivering them to a law enforcement agency from September 15 through September 30, 1978; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the period of September 15 through September 30, 1978 to be
