



Proclamation

WHEREAS: more than 15 million American women with children under the age of 18 are employed outside the home; and

WHEREAS: working mothers are making unique and substantial contributions both to the growth of the economy and the strength of the American family; and

WHEREAS: working mothers deserve special recognition for meeting their exceptional responsibilities in the home and in the world of commerce; and

WHEREAS: it is appropriate that particular attention be focused on the extraordinary accomplishments of this segment of American society;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, September 3, 1978 to be

WORKING MOTHERS DAY

in Minnesota and urge families, individual citizens, labor and civic organizations, the media and business to recognize and acknowledge the importance of the working mother and express public appreciation of her role in American society with a befitting realization that all mothers are working mothers.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this first day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred seventy-eight and of the State the one hundred twentieth.
