WHEREAS: Little Canada, Minnesota is hosting its annual celebration of Canadian Days in order to honor the good friendship that exists between the two countries which adjoin on the world's longest undefended border; and

WHEREAS: in 1961, President John F. Kennedy accurately told Canadians that "Geography has made us neighbors, history has made us friends"; and

WHEREAS: our own state of Minnesota borders on the Canadian province of Ontario; and

WHEREAS: two officials, Walter M. Assef and Mickey Hennessy from Little Canada's sister city, Thunder Bay, Ontario, will represent Canadian Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau at the Cotillion Ball held in conjunction with these festivities on August 13, 1978;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim August 11, 12, and 13, 1978 to be
