WHEREAS: WTCN-TV supports a continuing dialog with community leaders and the general public in an effort to determine the concerns and interests of the populace it serves; and


WHEREAS: WTCN-TV has demonstrated its business leadership and added measurably to the economy of the state of Minnesota;

in Minnesota.




