HEREAS: since its founding in 1945, the United Nations has provided a continuing forum for discussion and efforts to resolve international issues that endanger the peace of the world; and

HEREAS: the United Nations has also been a leader in international humanitarian activities; and

HEREAS: the United States has continued its active involvement in the United Nations for the past 33 years in order to take advantage of every possible opportunity to achieve international peace, human rights and human development; and

HEREAS: it is desirable for Minnesotans to be accurately informed about the broad range of activities of the United Nations; and

HEREAS: annually since the founding of the United Nations, one day and one week have been set aside as United Nations Day and United Nations Week throughout the Nation; and

HEREAS: the day and week of October 22, 1978 have been so designated;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, October 22, 1978 to be


UNITED NATIONS DAY

and the week of October 22, 1978 to be


UNITED NATIONS WEEK
