WHEREAS: *the earth is, in reality, one country and mankind its citizens; and*


WHEREAS: *we, in America, who have been given great opportunities and blessings must take the leadership in the quest for and the attainment of world peace;*


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, September 17, 1978 to be

WORLD PEACE DAY


