


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Tuesday, October 3, 1978 to be

KOREAN DAY


in Minnesota, and urge all citizens to mark this observance and pay tribute to the outstanding contributions made by the people of Korean descent in Minnesota.
