ORDINANCE NO. 52

The Minneapolis-Saint Paul Metropolitan Airports Commission ordains:

Section 1. Uniform Fire Code.

The Minnesota Uniform Fire Code, one copy of which has been marked as the official copy and which is on file in the office of the Minneapolis-Saint Paul Metropolitan Airports Commission, is hereby adopted as the Fire Code for the Minneapolis-Saint Paul Metropolitan Airports Commission for the purpose of prescribing regulations governing conditions hazardous to life and property from fire and explosion, except such portions as are modified or amended by Section 7 of this Ordinance. Every provision contained in this Code, except as modified or amended by this Ordinance, is hereby adopted and made a part of this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein.

Section 2. Enforcement.

(a) The Chief of the Fire Department serving the Minneapolis-Saint Paul Metropolitan Airports Commission, or his representative authorized by him, shall enforce the provisions of this Ordinance.

(b) The Chief of the Fire Department may detail such members of the Fire Department as inspectors as shall from time to time be necessary. The Chief of the Fire Department may recommend the employment of technical inspectors, who, when such authorization is made, shall be selected through an examination to determine their fitness for the position. The examination shall be open to members

and non-members of the fire department, and appointments made after examination shall be for an indefinite term with removal only for cause.

Section 3. Definitions.

(a) Wherever the word "jurisdiction" is used in the Minnesota Uniform Fire Code, it shall be held to mean The Minneapolis-Saint Paul International Airport-Wold Chamberlain Field.

(b) Wherever the term "corporation counsel" is used in the Minnesota Uniform Fire Code, it shall be held to mean counsel for the Minneapolis-Saint Paul Metropolitan Airports Commission.

Section 4. Establishment of Limits of Districts in Which Storage of Flammable or Combustible Liquids in Outside Above-ground Tanks is to be Prohibited.

Section 5. Establishment of Limits in which Bulk Storage of Liquefied Petroleum Gases is to be Restricted.

Section 6. Establishment of Limits of Districts in which Storage of Explosives and Blasting Agents is to be Prohibited.

Section 7. Amendments Made in the Minnesota Uniform Fire Code.

The Minnesota Uniform Fire Code is amended and changed in the following respects:

(a) Article 33.107 is stricken.

Section 8. Appeals.

Whenever the Chief shall disapprove an application or refuse to grant a permit applied for, or when it is claimed that the pro-

visions of the Code do not apply or that the true intent and meaning of the Code have been misconstrued or wrongly interpreted, the applicant may appeal from the decision of the Chief to the Commissioner whose "Collateral Duty Assignment(s)" include police and fire matters within thirty (30) days from the date of the decision appealed.

Section 9. New Materials, Processes or Occupancies which may Require Permits.

The Airport Director of Minneapolis-Saint Paul International Airport and the Chief shall act as a committee to determine and specify, after giving affected persons an opportunity to be heard, any new materials, processes or occupancies, which shall require permits, in addition to those now enumerated in said Code. The Chief shall post such list in a conspicuous place in his office, and distribute copies thereof to interested persons.

Section 10. Penalties.

(a) Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this Code hereby adopted or fail to comply therewith, or who shall violate or fail to comply with any order made thereunder, or who shall build in violation of any detailed statement or specifications or plans submitted and approved thereunder, or any certificate or permit issued thereunder, and from which no appeal has been taken, or who shall fail to comply with such an order as affirmed or modified by the Minneapolis-Saint Paul Metropolitan Airports Commission or by a court of competent jurisdiction, within the time fixed herein, shall severally for each and every such violation and noncompliance respectively, be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of

not exceeding \$500.00 and by imprisonment for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days. The imposition of one penalty for any violation shall not excuse the violation or permit it to continue; and all such persons shall be required to correct or remedy such violations or defects within a reasonable time; and when not otherwise specified, each ten (10) days that prohibited conditions are maintained shall constitute a separate offense.

(b) The application of the above penalty shall not be held to prevent the enforced removal of prohibited conditions.

Section 11. Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances.

All former Ordinances or parts thereof conflicting or inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance or of the Code hereby adopted are hereby repealed.

Section 12. Effective Date.

This Ordinance becomes effective from and after its passage and publication. Passed by the Minneapolis-Saint Paul Metropolitan Airports Commission this 21st day of August, 1978.
