WHEREAS: one of the primary objectives of the B'nai B'rith Girls program is to teach its members the spiritual values and tenets of American democracy through group-life experiences;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of December, 1978 to be

B'NAI B'RITH GIRLS MONTH


