

Proclamation

WHEREAS: each winter one or more areas of the United States are confronted by severe winter storms, blizzards, or freezing weather which are often accompanied by needless loss of life and extensive property damage; and

WHEREAS: the number of lives lost and the amount of property damage can be reduced by common sense winter preparations such as having an emergency plan in a household and refraining from driving in heavy snow or ice; and

WHEREAS: a number of Federal, State and private agencies are attempting to inform and educate the public on steps that should be taken to prepare for this winter; and


WHEREAS: by taking reasonable precautions, the people of our State can reduce adverse influences of winter on their daily lives, plus mitigate the effect of winter on our energy resources and our State's economy;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Thursday, December 14, 1978 to be

WINTER PREPAREDNESS DAY


in Minnesota, and authorize all appropriate State agencies to provide our people with warning and preparedness advice on a continuing basis throughout the 1978-1979 winter.
