FURTHERMORE, I encourage all Minnesotans to participate in activities that will promote lasting benefits for children here and throughout the world.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twelfth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred seventh-nine and of the State the one hundred twenty-first.

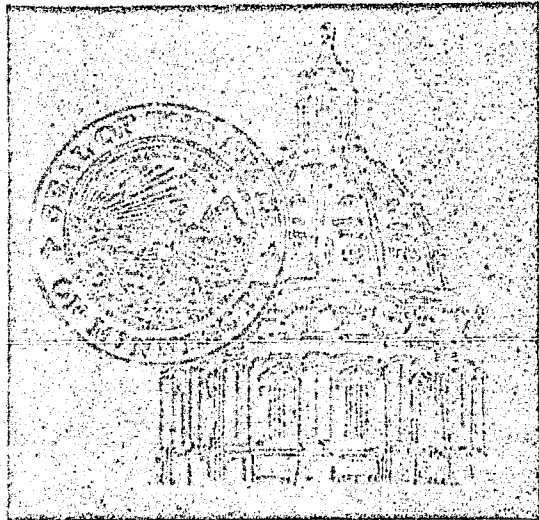
