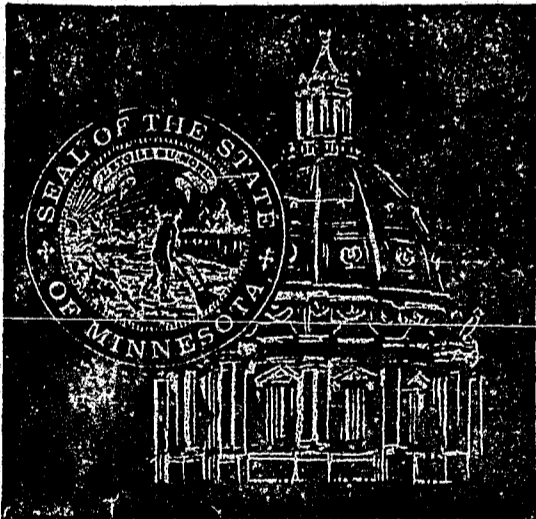

WHEREAS: Health care is an important component of quality of life in Minnesota;
