

## Proclamation

WHEREAS: Health care is an important component of quality of life in Minnesota;

WHEREAS: An important factor in the delivery of quality health care is the availability of sufficient supplies of blood and blood components; and

WHEREAS: Because blood has no synthetic substitute, only through the generosity of concerned citizens can this precious resource be made available to all in need; and
