



Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Our children and youth are Minnesota's greatest resource; and
- WHEREAS: Education should foster the development of recognized potential abilities in the areas of intelligence, creativity, academics, leadership, and visual and performing arts; and
- WHEREAS: The finding, maintaining, and furthering of these unusual human resources are primary concerns and obligations of the State of Minnesota and its educational systems; and
- WHEREAS: Minnesota has thousands of gifted and talented children whose full potential can only be tapped through the far-sighted cooperation of educators, the community, and government; and
- WHEREAS: Maximum development of each individual's intellectual and creative powers ensures that the challenges of the future can be met; and
- WHEREAS: The Minnesota Council for Gifted and Talented Children is holding its annual conference on February 9 and 10, 1979;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of February 11 through February 17, 1979, to be

GIFTED AND TALENTED YOUTH WEEK

in Minnesota, and urge that all local and state educational agencies and the citizenry at large consider how our schools might best serve these pupils.
