WHEREAS: Clear minds are required to make difficult decisions, operate complex machinery, provide courageous programs to right society's inequities, and maintain a concerned perspective on the future; and

WHEREAS: The body, the mind, and the spirit of the individual can be impaired by the use of alcohol, drugs, and tobacco; and

WHEREAS: The use of these substances can impede societal progress and stability by contributing to traffic fatalities, broken relationships, and crime.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 22 through April 28, 1979, to be
