



Proclamation

WHEREAS: There are more than 100,000 handicapped individuals in the State of Minnesota who could benefit from rehabilitation programs; and

WHEREAS: The benefits rehabilitants receive permit them to attain a greater degree of self-sufficiency, thus developing a deeper feeling of human dignity and worth; and

WHEREAS: Growth in an individual's level of self-sufficiency favorably affects the social and economic climate in the State of Minnesota;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim February 20, 1979, to be

REHABILITATION DAY

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens to give full support to the continuation and growth of programs which facilitate rehabilitation of handicapped individuals, to the benefit both of those individuals and the State generally.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this ninth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred seventy-nine, and of the State the one hundred twenty-first.
