



Proclamation

- WHEREAS: The Congress of the United States has recognized the growing and imperative need for job training programs and has placed the major responsibility of these programs within the realm of vocational-technical education; and
- WHEREAS: With strong state leadership and support, vocational-technical education is serving the educational needs of citizens at the high school, post-high school and adult levels; and
- WHEREAS: Through vocational guidance, counseling and special services, individuals are assisted in reaching their personal goals; and
- WHEREAS: Individual career goals and economic growth of the state are enhanced by training programs in occupational areas being demanded by business, industry, and labor; and
- WHEREAS: The American Vocational Association has designed the second week of February as "Vocational Education Week" and is supported by Minnesota vocational associations in this endeavor;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim February 11 through February 17, 1979, to be

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION WEEK

in Minnesota and urge all citizens to become aware of the services and opportunities available through Minnesota vocational-technical education.
