WHEREAS: Minnesota's soils and climate permit the large-scale production of numerous horticulture crops; and

WHEREAS: Among these crops are fruit, vegetables, potatoes, trees, flowers, turf, and shrubs, which are significant for their nutritional, economic, and aesthetic contributions to the lives of all Minnesotans; and

WHEREAS: In the future, as the world population continues to grow, renewable plant resources will play an ever more important role in the world economy, and horticultural industries will meet with expectations for increased output and productivity; and

WHEREAS: The University of Minnesota's Horticulture Industries Conference on February 26 and February 27, 1979, is aimed at bringing together the many components of the horticulture industry for an educational experience that will aid in the development of the industry to the benefit of all Minnesotans;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week February 25 through March 3, 1979, to be

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens to become familiar with the enormous contributions of the horticulture industry to their personal well-being and the vitality of the State.
