
On July 13, 1921, I sent you a copy of my consular Exequatur, issued by the Department of State at Washington.

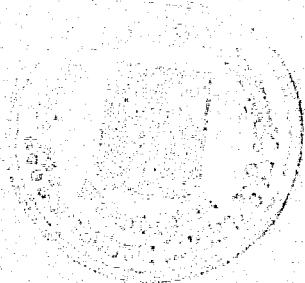
