WHEREAS: The American Red Cross embarked on a bold venture in public health

thirty - one years ago to meet the peacetime needs for blood; and

WHEREAS: State of Minnesota employees were among the first to donate blood

regularly when the St. Paul Red Cross Regional Blood Center opened in 1948 and; since 1955, in bloodmobile operations in the Capitol

area; and

WHEREAS: The impressive participation in blood donation programs by State

employees helps assure the good health of all Minnesotans;
