WHEREAS: Rod Carew, in his seasons with the Minnesota Twins was not only a great baseball player, but an outstanding and valued citizen of our state; and

WHEREAS: Rod Carew starred for the Minnesota Twins for twelve years, and has been a member of the American League All-Star team in every one of his twelve major league seasons; and

WHEREAS: Rod Carew has won the American League batting championship seven times, more than any other active player, and his average of .388 in 1977 was the highest batting average recorded in the major leagues in twenty years; and

WHEREAS: Rod Carew returns to Minnesota today, April 17, 1979, the opening day of the 1979 major league baseball season, as a member of the California Angels;
