WHEREAS: All Minnesotans must become more aware of the problems which face our state's handicapped citizens, as well as the significant contributions they are capable of making to the well-being of us all if given full opportunity and access to society's resources;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of May 13 through May 19, 1979, to be
