HEREAS: The students of the Minnesota State Universities represent, in a very real sense, the future of Minnesota; and

HEREAS: One purpose of education in a democratic society is to produce citizens capable of participating in and contributing to that society, including the governmental processes; and

HEREAS: All citizens have a right and an obligation to be informed on issues of public concern and to convey their opinions to the duly-elected public officials; and

HEREAS: Students at Minnesota State Universities have come to play an ever more important role in all phases of the political process in Minnesota;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Thursday, April 26, 1979, to be

in Minnesota, and do extend to all students visiting the State Capitol a sincere and enthusiastic welcome.
