



# Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Young people who have dropped out of school before completing their high school education often require unique assistance to obtain challenging and satisfying employment; and
- WHEREAS: The benefits of enhancing the motivation, self-image, and productivity of this segment of our society are considerable, both in economic and human terms; and
- WHEREAS: 70001 Limited is a program for unemployed, out-of-school youth between the ages of 16 and 22, which helps participants gain employment and improve their personal skills, motivation, and self-confidence while stimulating their desire to obtain additional educational and social competencies; and
- WHEREAS: 70001, founded in 1969 by the Distributive Education Clubs of America, has grown to be an independent, non-profit corporation operating in 22 cities of the United States, with the help of both public and private funds; and
- WHEREAS: 70001 has spawned a youth organization, SEVCA, which serves the specific motivational and educational needs of high school dropouts and recognizes their positive economic, educational, and social achievements;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of May, 1979, to be

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens to become more aware of this program which has aided so many young people.
