



# Proclamation

WHEREAS: Licensed nursing homes and other long-term health facilities in Minnesota contribute to the public good by providing individualized rehabilitative, social, and spiritual services as well as medical and nursing care for our aged, chronically ill, and the convalescent; and

WHEREAS: The State of Minnesota is appreciative of the many dedicated people who provide skilled and compassionate care for our elderly in nursing homes and is also grateful for the many generous contributions of nursing home residents to our quality of life; and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Association of Homes for the Aging, representing not-for-profit homes in our state, is observing Nursing Home Week in 1979 with the theme "Caring and Sharing Together;" and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Association of Health Care Facilities, representing proprietary and non-proprietary homes in our state, will observe Nursing Home Week under the sponsorship of the American Health Care Association, with the theme "Love is Ageless;"
