EAS: Minnesota's economic well-being is increasingly tied to that of other nations and

EAS: Current shortages of food, energy, and other basic commodities emphasize the interdependence of all people of the world, and demonstrate the need for peace and cooperation among nations to manage our planet's scarce resources; and

EAS: Exports of our agricultural and industrial products have enhanced the health of Minnesota's economy by accelerating growth and increasing the earnings of our citizens; and

EAS: Importation of foreign products provides a base for international investment in Minnesota, providing us with additional capital that provides opportunities and jobs for our citizens; and

EAS: All Minnesotans should welcome international interest and involvement in our economy, which contributes to our well-being;

THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of May 20 through May 26, 1979, to be
