WHEREAS: It is incumbent upon us to recognize with honesty and clarity that o attitudes and treatment of American Indian peoples have not always been jue and honorable and that in order to become citizens together there must be recognition and sharing of values and ideas for our mutual benefit; a

WHEREAS: We lament the near loss of valuable customs, ceremonies and traditions native peoples, we pledge to work together toward the restoration and mai tenance of heritage and pride, and to the uniting of our mutual strengt and resources in making better lives for us all; and

WHEREAS: We seek Divine guidance and the combined commitment and compassion of a the peoples of the State of Minnesota in achieving this goal;

YOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do here proclaim the week of May 6 through May 12, 1979, to be
