HEREAS: Americans of Germanic ancestry have contributed in great measure to the settlement of Minnesota and the building of our great state;

HEREAS: Americans of German ancestry in Minnesota and throughout the nation have served the cause of freedom here with great distinction; and

HEREAS: The contributions to America from those of German origin are many -- evidence of this can be seen daily from Minnesota's northern forests, to our cities, and in classrooms and research laboratories of our colleges and universities;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, June 10, 1979, to be
