



Proclamation

WHEREAS: The Peace Corps will be recruiting in Minnesota June 24 through June 29, 1979, seeking agricultural volunteers for Peace Corps programs; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota is a leading agricultural state, and has traditionally been a bountiful source of volunteers for the Peace Corps; and

WHEREAS: The success of the Peace Corps mission depends upon the participation, understanding and faith of Americans -- faith in the power of men and women to translate their convictions into action, faith in the desire of other nations to welcome with patience and goodwill those who come to them offering not money or goods, but only themselves; and

WHEREAS: The Peace Corps is a movement of proven effectiveness that places the vessel of peace in the hands of individual men and women who are driven by their own consciences to do something about improving their world;

I, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of June 24 through June 29, 1979, to be

PEACE CORPS AGRICULTURAL WEEK

Minnesota, and urge all citizens to be attentive to the many special activities that will mark this period.
