



Proclamation

WHEREAS: The Continental Congress of the United States formally adopted the "stars and stripes" design of our national flag on June 14, 1777; and

WHEREAS: June 14, traditionally celebrated throughout the United States as Flag Day, is a special time for all Americans to rededicate themselves to the principles which have made this country great; and

WHEREAS: The flag of the United States has flown proudly over our land for two hundred and two years, symbolizing the blessings of liberty and justice that have favored generation after generation of American citizens;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Thursday, June 14, 1979, to be
