WHEREAS: We are privileged to live in a nation which holds freedom as its highest ideal; and

WHEREAS: Life in the United States has changed profoundly in the past two centuries, but the American people have remained true to their proud heritage of liberty; and

WHEREAS: The twenty-one day period between Flag Day -- the birthday of our Stars and Stripes -- and Independence Day -- the birthday of the Declaration of Independence -- is a fitting time to celebrate our nation's rich history and the principles for which it stands yet today;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the period from June 14 through July 4, 1979, as a time to
