WHEREAS: Members of local boards of education expend countless hours to assure the highest possible quality of education for the children of their communities, rewarded by the knowledge that they are helping these young Minnesotans develop their full potentials as human beings; and

WHEREAS: The State of Minnesota appreciates the dedication of these outstanding public servants, whose efforts enhance the quality of life for all citizens;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Tuesday, July 17, 1979, to be
