WHEREAS: Susan B. Anthony demonstrated impressive strength of character throughout her life, never succumbing to failure in her difficult struggle for human rights, always persevering despite setbacks, persecution and heartbreaks; and

WHEREAS: Susan B. Anthony continues to serve as an inspiration to all who stand for equality and human dignity in our nation and throughout the world; and

WHEREAS: The United States government is honoring the memory and ideals of Susan B. Anthony through the issue of a newly-designed dollar coin, beginning July 2, 1979; and

WHEREAS: This coin, the first in our nation's history to bear the image of a woman other than a symbol or royalty, will be a constant reminder of the continuing struggle for equality of all Americans;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of July, 1979, to be

SUSAN B. ANTHONY MONTH

in honor of the inspiring achievements of Susan B. Anthony and the issuance of this unique new coin.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this eighteenth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred seventy-nine, and of the State the one hundred twenty-second.
