WHEREAS: Water skiing was invented at Lake Pepin in Lake City, Minnesota, by the late Ralph W. Samuelson in 1922; and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Water Ski Association will host the 1979 Midwest Regional Water Ski Championships, the nation's second largest water ski tournament, on August 3, 4, and 5 at Island Lake in Shoreview; and

WHEREAS: The tournament program is being dedicated to the late Mr. Samuelson in recognition of his many achievements and contributions as the "father" of water skiing;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim August 4, 1979, to be

in Minnesota, and wish all tournament participants an exciting and enjoyable weekend of activity.
