WHEREAS: The Governor's Conference on the Lighted School, convened by Governor Harold LeVander on December 5, 1969, held the beginnings of the notion of community education; and

WHEREAS: Since that gathering, community education has come to operate in more than 300 Minnesota school districts, and our state has risen to a position of national leadership in this field of endeavor; and

WHEREAS: In 1979, at the tenth anniversary of that important conference, the idea that our schools should serve everyone in the community, from pre-schoolers through senior citizens, is continuing to expand in our state, and has a promising future;

NOW, THEREFORE, WE, Albert H. Quie and Lou Wangberg, Governor and Lieutenant Governor, of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of December 3 through 7, 1979, to be

COMMUNITY EDUCATION WEEK

in Minnesota, and commend all involved in this program that enhances the lives of thousands of our citizens.
