

Proclamation

WHEREAS: The history of Minnesota is a fascinating story of people from every corner of the world coming together to live and work; and

WHEREAS: The common interests of all Minnesotans in the economic and cultural vitality of their state are complemented by the desire of many to actively maintain ties with their ethnic heritage; and

WHEREAS: The Iron Range Interpretive Center will be celebrating the Second Annual Minnesota Ethnic Days during the period of August 9 through August 19, 1979; and

WHEREAS: The Center will celebrate Minnesota's rich heritage by developing a theme each day highlighting the music, food, arts and crafts, costumes and lifestyles of specific ethnic groups, including ethnic entertainment each day in the afternoon and evening;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the period from August 9 through August 19, 1979, to be

MINNESOTA ETHNIC DAYS

and encourage every citizen to take part in this unique and interesting celebration of our heritage.
