WHEREAS: The nearly 900 Community Action Agencies in our nation have proven useful in this task, providing helpful assistance to millions of citizens; and


WHEREAS: The many benefits that have accrued to Minnesotans from the Community Action Agencies operating in our state make it appropriate that this fifteenth anniversary of the signing of the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964 be officially recognized;
