WHEREAS: The presence of an effective, humane juvenile justice system can make the difference between a productive life and one filled with crime and violence for the young people of our state; and

WHEREAS: Professionals in a variety of institutions, agencies, and non-profit organizations, encompassing the fields of law enforcement, education, corrections and welfare, are concerned and active in setting and administering juvenile justice policy in Minnesota; and

WHEREAS: Representatives of all these groups will meet in Saint Paul on September 7-8, 1979, at a statewide Juvenile Justice Conference sponsored by the Juvenile Justice Advisory Committee of the Minnesota Crime Control Planning Board;

NOW, THEREFORE, WE, Albert H. Quie and Lou Wangberg, Governor and Lieutenant Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim September 7 and September 8, 1979, to be

JUVENILE JUSTICE DAYS

in Minnesota, and encourage all citizens to be attentive to this conference, and be supportive of efforts that will better the juvenile justice system in our state.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we have hereunto set our hands and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-seventh day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred seventy-nine, and of the State the one hundred twenty-second.
