WHEREAS: Lupus Erythematosus is a chronic inflammatory disease of the body's connective tissue that occurs in two forms; Discoid, which affects the skin, and Systemic, which strikes internally; and

WHEREAS: It is far more prevalent than many other well-publicized diseases; and

WHEREAS: It is relatively unknown and should be given much public exposure; and

WHEREAS: President Carter, on August 13, 1979, did so proclaim the week of September 16 through 22, 1979, to be NATIONAL LUPUS WEEK;

NOW, THEREFORE, WE, Albert H. Quie and Lou Wangberg, Governor and Lieutenant Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of September 16 through 22, 1979, to be
