WHEREAS: These persons are of normal intelligence, but are handicapped by a disorder in one or more of the basic learning patterns involved in understanding or in using language; and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Association for Children with Learning Disabilities is a non-profit organization dedicated to the advancement of the education and general welfare of these children and adults; and

WHEREAS: A state-wide campaign to inform the public about this special problem has been planned for the month of October;

NOW, THEREFORE, WE, Albert H. Quie and Lou Wangberg, Governor and Lieutenant Governor, of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of October to be

LEARNING DISABILITIES MONTH

in Minnesota, and urge all parents, educators and physicians to focus their attention on early recognition and seek appropriate assistance for these children and adults, so that they may develop their fullest potential as contributing members of society.
