WHEREAS: The progress and well-being of the citizens of Minnesota depend to a great extent upon their mastering a changed world through continuing education; and

WHEREAS: Private, voluntary, religious, recreational, business and industrial agencies, realize the importance of adult education as evidenced by their establishment of and support of adult continuing education programs; and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota State Legislature and Minnesota Board of Education have recognized, by their continued support of programs, the efficacy of public adult education; and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Association for Continuing Adult Education has established the third week in October as "Adult Education Week";

NOW, THEREFORE, WE, Albert H. Quie and Lou Wangberg, Governor and Lieutenant Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim the week of October 14 through 20, 1979, to be

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens of the state to make themselves better acquainted with all phases of Adult and Continuing Education by Visiting and enrolling in classes in their schools, colleges, churches, businesses, libraries, museums, recreational facilities, and other agencies offering programs for adults.
