

WHEREAS: The State of Minnesota has established the policy of state support for local planning and development of services designed to protect and improve people's health within their own community with the passage of the Community Health Services Act of 1976; and

WHEREAS: The Act focuses on programs designed to prevent disease, to promote health, to provide alternatives to institutional care, and to provide a community focus for citizens' efforts to be responsible for their own health; and

WHEREAS: State and local government officials and their citizen advisors are working cooperatively to develop and maintain an integrated system of community health services with state guidelines and standards;

NOW, THEREFORE, WE, Albert H. Quie and Lou Wangberg, Governor and Lieutenant Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim the week of October 15 through 19, 1979 as

COMMUNITY HEALTH SERVICES WEEK

in Minnesota, and urge all citizens to recognize the outstanding community development achievements of local government officials, advisory committee members and medical consultants in providing community health services in eighty-four Minnesota counties.
