WHEREAS: Local Reading Is Fun projects in our state will be among thousands across the country distributing books to young people and promoting reading on October 11, 1979;

NOW, THEREFORE, WE, Albert H. Quie and Lou Wangberg, Governor and Lieutenant Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim October 11, 1979 as

READING IS FUN DAY
