

WHEREAS: The Women's Division of the National Safety Council represents some 60 members at large and 67 national and international women's organizations with an outreach to 58 million women; and

WHEREAS: The Women's Conference has recognized the need for, and initiated a National Crusade to have Safety on the Streets; and

WHEREAS: The Safety On The Streets Crusade represents an action-oriented program for volunteers nationwide, who marshal the human resources of their communities and public service, civic, fraternal, and law enforcement agencies to have safe neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS: Program aspects of Safety On the Streets include automobile, bicycle, pedestrian, personal, and school safety, with public support being urged for alcohol and drug countermeasures, improved street lighting, and national highway safety standards:

NOW, THEREFORE, WE, Albert H. Quie and Lou Wangberg, Governor and Lieutenant Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of October 28 through November 3, 1979 as

SAFETY ON THE STREETS WEEK

in Minnesota and urge all citizens to recognize the outstanding contributions of volunteer womanpower, throughout the State of Minnesota and throughout the nation, united to have Safety On The Streets.
