WHEREAS: The U.S. Olympic Committee has selected Minnesota's own University of Minnesota hockey coach, Herb Brooks, as the 1980 Olympic Hockey Team Coach, and

WHEREAS: Hockey contributes to the State of Minnesota in many positive ways, impacting in areas of industry, recreation, tourism, and at the same time promoting state pride as a source of recognition in the excellence of hockey in the State of Minnesota;

NOW, THEREFORE, WE, Albert H. Quie and Lou Wangberg, Governor and Lieutenant Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Tuesday, November 27, 1979, to be
