NOW, THEREFORE, WE, Albert H. Quie and Lou Wangberg, Governor and Lieutenant Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim November 15 through November 19, 1979 as

in Minnesota, and encourage all citizens to be with a book of their choice and show their support of libraries in the state.
