Proclamation

WHEREAS: Mentally retarded children and adults in Minnesota need a helping hand with special outdoor educational and therapeutic services; and

WHEREAS: Such services contribute to greater independence and achievement for those so handicapped, this increasing the number of useful, dignified human lives; and

WHEREAS: The right of the citizens to provide such services voluntarily is a sacred privilege of a free society; and

WHEREAS: CAMP CONFIDENCE, a year around camp and outdoor education facility serving the mentally retarded citizens of Minnesota FREE OF CHARGE, is equipped to provide modified outdoor educational and therapeutic programs efficiently and effectively; and

WHEREAS: Restaurants, hotels, drug stores, hospitals, schools and coffee shops have joined with the Minnesota Restaurant Association to implement "CAMP CONFIDENCE COFFEE DAY" with all proceeds from coffee sales and coffee day buttons going to aid Camp Confidence;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim Friday, February 22, 1980, to be

CAMP CONFIDENCE COFFEE DAY

in Minnesota, and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same. I further urge all citizens to lend a helping hand to our Minnesota mentally retarded citizens in need of outdoor, educational and therapeutic services.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we have hereunto set our hands and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fourteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred eighty, and of the State the one hundred twenty-second.
